## Peter Coe Cup Success & New Club Record for Sid

The under 13s made club history on Sunday by winning the club's first ever Peter Coe Cup match in a 89 runs victory against Fives & Heronians which was well lead by Captain Ben Little scoring 37 and well supported by Jamie Eacott 31, Scott Mansfield 22no and Will Knowlden 14 as 155 for 7 was scored from 30 overs on the same pitch the 1<sup>st</sup> XI deemed a complete nightmare to play on the previous day!

A real team effort in the field secured the victory with wickets being shared by all the bowlers to dismiss Fives for 66. Well done to all the team of Will Knowlden, Jamie Eacott, Ben Little, Ben Brindley, Scott Mansfield, Daniel Purton, Jake Downton, Tommy Brandon, Billy Purton, Anthony Connor and Jack Wallace for ensuring their place in club history.

Manager Paul Newman stated 'I am so proud of all the boys who all played well. I set them a target of batting the full 30 overs, scoring over 150 and based on Fives previous results keeping the opposition to under 200. I think a lot of the boys must have misheard me as they must have thought I said keep the opposition to under 100!'

Another special moment came from 1<sup>st</sup> team opening batsman Sid Patel as he played faultlessly in breaking his own individual scoring record for Rainham CC in the T-Rippon Mid-Essex league by scoring 155 not out, which Jono described as 'The finest innings he has ever seen' against Writtle, and all were needed in a 1 run nail biting last over victory. A great effort from Sid who is in good form this season, so let's hope it will be the first on many centuries this season.

## **Playing Update**

## 1st Team

The month got off to a real nail biting start with victories of contrasting natures with first up a high scoring match at Writtle culminating in a last over victory by one run, with the highlight being Sid Patel's club record breaking 155no in a total of 250. This was followed by a match against Great Waltham who were bowled out for just 58 on a Spring Farm Park pitch that was under rolled during the week due to a problem with the roller, thanks to 4 wickets from Dipal patel and 3 from Biren Patel. Every other club would assume a straight forward run chase, but this is Rainham CC and we ensure that a game has to be exciting as 8 wickets were lost in the small run chase with Tom Herbert being the hero of the day and showing a mature head on young shoulders by steering the team to victory with 13 no, assisted by number 10 Charlie Puncher with 2 valuable match winning runs.

Rain was the victor in the next match as Rayleigh II posted a total of 187 for 9 as spinners Alex Sullivan and Biren Patel shared 6 of the Rayleigh wickets. In reply Rainham lost the early wickets of Alex Sullivan and

Garnet Shallow with Sid unbeaten on 20 as the rain came to wash the game out with Rainham on 38 for 2 and the game finely poised.

The month finished with a fine all round team display away at Little Waltham. Rainham batted first and were struggling on 50 for 5 when the middle and lower order brought the score to some respectability with Ronnie top scoring on 39, Skipper 28, Biren 25, Dipal 24no and Tom Herbert 10 and a team total of 197 all out. The momentum kept going as Jono and Jas took early wickets, well supported by Biren and Garnet to bowl Little Waltham out for 121 and an excellent all round team display.

This leaves the first team top of the table at the half way stage and they take on in form  $2^{nd}$  in the table South Weald on the first Saturday in July.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Team

In contrast to the 1<sup>st</sup> XI the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI had a disappointing start to the month with a 1 wicket loss to top of the table Great Wakering followed by a big loss to Bentley III by over 100 runs on a week when player availability was short, with the few highlights being George Light's consistent form with the bat, scoring his maiden club 50 with 63 and Abdul Altaf taking 2 wickets in 2 balls. It's a shame George felt unwell after the game, which was mainly down to the thought of him having to buy a jug!

A better end to the month with rained off match at Eastwood in a game that was also finely poised with Eastwood scoring 187 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> team 29 for 2 in reply. The final match was a home victory against South Weald II notable for a good team display with bat and ball with Joe Sarro scoring 55, Paul Collis 38, Harry Light 32no and a fine Captain's innings from Gibbo on 30no. The bowlers also responded with Tyler taking 3 wickets, new by Craig 3 wickets and a good all round match for Harry also taking 3 wickets as South Weald were bowled out for 181 chasing 221. This win takes the 2nds up to 3<sup>rd</sup> place and just 9 points away from a promotional spot.

# 3rd Team

The start of the month was a match against top of the table Little Baddow III for Brearley's young Lions. Rainham batted first as Bradley Manning found some form by top scoring with 47, which was well supported by opener Adam Savery in a total of 170 for 7. If the batting went well, then the bowling and fielding display was even better as the Baddow Captain described the effort as an 'In your face display of bowling and fielding' which ended up with Baddow being dismissed for just 66, as the wickets were shared by Alan Aviss, Abdul Altaf, Charlie Puncher, Nakul Patel and Umer Ellahi.

The other 2 matches in the month were a rained off game against local rivals Goresbrook, where Rainham batted first and posted a respectable 176 for 7 thanks to a maiden 50 from Warren Courtney and good support from Neeral Patel followed by a business as usual win at Thames against Bentley IV, with Rushi taking 5 wickets dismissing the opposition for 118. Bradley Manning with 28 and Brearley with 17no guided Rainham to a 6 wicket victory as the 3rds remain unbeaten and lay 2<sup>nd</sup> in the table.

## **Sunday**

Three matches for the Sunday XI with 2 victories and a loss against Orsett. The first win was a league game against Tree caps with Nikhil continuing his excellent Sunday form with the bat scoring 57 and Biren giving excellent support scoring 46 as Rainham scored 212. Three Caps were dismissed for 118 as the Sunday XI make it 2 league wins out of 2.

The final match was away at Thurrock and all the Patels' unavailable due to a visit to the Wireless Festival! Charlie Puncher manfully stood in as captain and gathered a team of youngsters and first time debutants Dal Lehal and Keith Manning (was this mainly because they had big cars?). Daniel Courtney also made his senior Sunday debut and started impressively taking 3 wickets, but was surpassed by Charlie taking 4 wickets. Tyler top scored with the bat scoring 41, followed by Dal Lehal with 36 (not just selected for his driving skills) and a display to match that of Brearley as Charlie also contributed 30 with the bat as the Sunday XI were guided to a surprise victory.

#### **Youth Section**

#### Under 15s

Four matches for the under 15s which started with a heavy defeat against a string Upminster 'A' side notable for the 2 wickets from Rainham's man of the match Neeraj Sunder. The following week was time to put this defeat behind them as it was another trip to Havering atte Bower, but this time in the league. Rainham batted first and Will Knowlden continued his liking for batting at this ground as he scored another 30 not out, which was followed by Ben Little also scoring 30 not out. Harry Spear and Raj Hothi both scored 16 and Daniel Courtney 12 not out as Rainham scored 133 in 20 overs. Havering were bowled out for 93 with Daniel Purton being the pick of the bowlers with 2 wickets for 4 runs and it was welcome back to James Clark after a knee injury taking a wicket for 7 runs.

On the Friday of the same week he under 15s travelled to Gidea Park and Romford and bowled first with James Clark taking 2 wickets from his 4 overs for just 8 runs. After 11 overs Gidea Park were 55 for 4, but some sloppy fielding and leg side bowling took the opposition's total to 146 for 6.

Harry Spear and Jamie Eacott batted well opening and both made double figures before being dismissed. The rain came to the rescue as the under 15s were 46 for 5 in 13 overs.

Hornchurch were next at Harrow Lodge Park and Rainham batted first and posted a disappointing 53 for 9 in 20 overs with Jamie Eacott being the only batsman to score double figures. James Clark and Neeraj Sunder batted well at the end, both being undefeated. Hornchurch lost an early wicket as Rainham bowled and fielded a lot better, but couldn't prevent Hornchurch reaching their target in the 11<sup>th</sup> over, with Daniel Purton being the pick of the Rainham bowlers.
