What a Season!

The last league match of the season set up a tense finale for the First XI, with 8 points required to secure promotion against Little Waltham, this was after the Second XI had secured top position in division 7 the previous week and the Third XI won division 11 the week previous to that.

Dodgy weather the night before meant the toss was vital to win and Jas called correct and put Little Waltham into bat. A couple of quick wickets put Waltham on the back foot, but then a key moment in the match as their next batsman was dropped by Jas on nought. 109 runs later he was bowled by Ronnie and many wickets tumbled with Ronnie being the pick of the bowlers with 4 for 36 as Little Waltham were 197 all out. Rainham were keen to get out and knock the runs off to secure promotion, but immediately after the tea break the heavens opened and no further ball was bowled. The 10 wickets taken ensured 5 bonus points and the match being abandoned secured another 5 points to keep fellow promotion chasers Hornchurch Athletic at bay. Not the ideal way to go up, but sweet none the less.

During the course of the promotion chase Tom Herbert earned his club tie by claiming 5 wicket keeper victims with 3 catches and 2 stumpings in the emphatic win against Great Waltham.

Well done to Gibbo's 2^{nd} XI who the previous week against Eastwood 2nds secured a 23 point victory to finish top of Division 7, with a game in hand.

Brearley's storming 3rd XI went one better and won division 11 in a controversial win against Great Totham 3rds in a match that all that played are likely never to play another like it. Rainham batted first at Thames RFC and were dismissed for just 53 and then went on to bowl Totham out for just 37, with Anish Patel also claiming a club honours tie with 6 for 14.

Playing Update

1st Team

A strong start to the month with 3 wins out of 3 against Rayleigh Fairview, a nail biter against Writtle and a comfortable win against Great Waltham with notable performances from Sid Patel 51 & Tigsy 48 against Rayleigh Fairview, Jas 46, Alex 35, Rushi 30no v Writtle, and Sid 89no v Great Waltham. A win was required in the penultimate game v 3rd from bottom Rayleigh 2nds to secure promotion, but a hesitant batting display with only Garnet with 55 and Skipper with 35 doing themselves justice. This was followed by an early lacklustre performance in the field, which picked up towards the end as Jono picked up 4 wickets to leave Rayleigh 8 down with 20 runs to win. A couple of good overs for Rayleigh saw them secure victory with one over to spare.

 2^{nd} Team

After a 100% record the previous month the 2^{nd} kept their momentum going during the course of August with 4 straight wins against Danbury, top of the table Great Wakering, Bentley III and Eastwood II and final match slip up against South Weald II. The match against Great Wakering was notable for the absence of 4 Rainham players who were stuck in traffic and as the opposition chose to bat, some excellent bowling from Harry Light and Tyler Bunn ensured that Great Wakering did not take advantage of the situation. Excellent keeping from Mickey Clifford with 4 catches ensured Wakering were kept to 192 in their 45 overs. Rainham chased it losing just 4 wickets to take over Wakering as table toppers, which set up a tense match against Bentley III the following week.

A win against Bentley III would ensure promotion and Rainham batted first at home and scored a modest 188 for 9. Some accurate bowling and early wickets ensured Rainham looked comfortable and then all of a sudden a surge of runs from Bentley set up a tense last few overs, which could have gone either way, but Craig Miller ensured victory by dismissing the last Bentley batsman to secure promotion.

The following week was a less tense affair with Tyler Bunn claiming 5 Eastwood II wickets as they were dismissed for 157 and Rainham chased it losing 6 wickets to ensure they had enough points to finish top of the table with one match remaining.

3rd Team

The first week in August saw Brearley's invincibles lose their first match against Navestock II by just 6 runs, as the last wicket stand of Brearley and Umer scored 40 runs before Brearley was dismissed dancing down the wicket trying to play his trade mark nurdle.

Not to be down trodden by this defeat the 3rds immediately hot the ground running as fellow promotion chasers Little Baddow III were the next visitors to Thames and were dismissed for 90. Rainham lost 6 wickets chasing it to secure victory knowing that a win the following week could secure promotion.

Next up were Great Totham III in what proved to be a controversial game as it looked as though the second defeat of the season was on the cards as Rainham were bowled out for just 53 with Brearley top scoring on 14. An inspired bowling spell from Anish Patel taking 6 wickets lead the way to the opposition being dismissed for just 37 and Great Totham reporting the Thames pitch to the league! With other results going the 3rds way this ensured the 3rds would finish top of Division 11.

The following week should have been a local game against Goresbrook but was moved to Billericay as we were not allowed to play at Thames. This was a match where Charlie Puncher decided it was time to become an all-rounder after he had consistently taken wickets all season. Rainham opened the batting and scored 274 for 7 with Charlie leading the way with 70 runs and well supported by Ben Little with 23no after his brave 0 no the previous week in his senior debut against Totham. Goresbrook were all out for just 115 as a 12th victory was secured for the 3rds.

The last match was an icing on the cake day as the 3rds travelled to the nice ground of Bentley with Neeral just 7 runs short of a ton. Charlie Puncher carried on his form with the bat scoring 48 and Hari Patel then came out of semi- retirement to claim 4 Bentley wickets in a 150 runs victory.

Sunday

What a difference year makes as last season the Sunday XI finished bottom of the Sunday league but 2 victories up to now ensured Rainham were still in the mix and a further victory against Hainault and Clayhall ensured this was still the case. Nikhil lead the way with 38 runs and Biren did the same with the ball taking 3 for 18.

The Sunday XI were then keen to take on Harold Wood Academy later on in the month knowing that a win in this match would ensure they still had a chance of winning the league, but the good old British weather done its best to ensure the game was washed out without a ball being bowled. One more league match in September should ensure a top half or even a top 3 finish for the Sunday XI this season.

There were also 2 friendlies against East Ham Corinthians and Trini Wanderers which were 2 contrasting games. The first being a low scoring affair against Trini Wanderers with Nakul adding to his club record 7 wickets the previous week by taking a further 5 wanderers scalps for just 18 runs and was well supported by Tyler Bunn (3 for 7) as the opposition were bowled out for just 78. Jas moved the score on quickly scoring 40 not out to claim the win in just 12 overs.

The East Ham Corinthian game was the complete opposite as Rainham posted 210 for 8 with Nikhil showing more excellent Sunday form with the bat scoring 69 and was well supported by Neeral with 58. East Ham Corinthians were positive in their run chase, but were steadily losing wickets. Eventually with just one wicket left Corinthians reached their target in an excellent game of cricket.

Under 13s

Only 2 matches left for the under 13s in a busy season. The first was against Harold Wood in what was a disappointing all-round display. Early short and wide ensured Harold Wood raced to 50 runs in no time at all, as 2 of their batsmen retired not out on 30 runs. The pick of the Rainham bowlers was Anthony Connor taking 2 for 14 as Harold Wood scored 115 for 5 in their 20 overs.

Anthony then opened the batting with under 11 Charlie Vickers as they both set about the run chase in positive fashion scoring 40 runs off the first 4 overs. Anthony was eventually dismissed for 8 and Charlie retired not out on 32. A casual mind set then set in as the general feeling was the game was won but some tidy bowling and casual batting saw Rainham wicket fall at regular interval with only Raj Hothi 18 and Ben Brindley 8 showing any resistance as Rainham finished 10 runs short of their target in what must be one of the most disappointing under 13 displays of the season.

The last match was against Upminster A and it would seem all the boys wanted to get the disappointment of the Harold Wood defeat out of their system. Upminster batted first and lost an early wicket, caught raj bowled Daniel Purton. A tidy spell of bowling from Will Knowlden at the other end claimed 2 further wickets for just 14 runs in his 4 over spell, Good support from Anthony, Ben and Raj restricted Upminster to 98 runs.

In response Jamie and Raj got off to a steady start before the runs continued to flow at a steady rate, but they both lost their wicket for 13 and 7 respectively. Ben Little 3no and Will Knowlden 23no took the score to 56 for 2 after 12 over which set up a potentially exciting finish before bad light and rain intervened.

Under 11s

There were 3 reaming games left for Jay's under 11 against Gidea Park, Harold Wood and Upminster B. First up was an way match against Gidea Park with the promise of some great homemade cakes to tuck into during the break. Rainham batted first and Charlie Vickers and Kyan Lehal got the team off to a good start with Charlie scoring 8 and Kyan adding 13, which seemed to give the momentum for the rest of the batting line up as every single batsman contributed with Alfie Stounchbury top scoring on 15 an excellent support from Bobby Little 7, Flynn 6, Billy 5. Olly 4, Leo 3, Alfie Clark 2 and Jamie Little 2 ensuring 295 runs were posted for Gidea Park to chase.


Youth Section Presentation Night Saturday 5th September
