
# **Tour Opener & Under 12s First Peter Coe Cup Success**

First of all: apologies for the delay in getting the latest newsletter out. Time has been an issue so April and May's news will be combined

The wet start at the season finally got under way with Jono's organised tour to Trowbridge, over the weekend of 22<sup>nd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> April, which was a real club bonding trip to a very nice part of the world. The first match of the tour was also victim of the weather as the match against Trowbridge was cancelled, which may have been a relief to some (Tom & Biren!) after a long night out in Bath. Others found ways of making the most of their day by taking a trip to Bath to watch the Bath v Sale Sharks premier league Rugby Union match.

The following day was a nice gentle drive to Warminster where the sun shone and the facilities were fantastic with their own indoor net and a lovely looking ground and pitch. Rainham batted with Sid, Biren and Jas batting well getting into the 20s, but no one failed to do better as some tight bowling, especially from their young opening bowler, ensure Rainham were dismissed for 131. Some may say this was down to a second consecutive long night in Bath. Warminster made the runs with 15 overs to spare losing just 3 wickets from Dipal, Abdul and Charlie. The bowling display was memorable for Jono's first ball bearing a close resemblance to Steve Harmison's first ball at Brisbane in the 2006/07 Ashes series in Australia and Joe Attfield doing the best to destroy the car that took him down to Trowbridge by bowling a series of long hops and full tosses. There was even a rumour that Harry Light may actually play some cricket on a cricket tour!

Overall the tour was a great success with everyone having a good time, so let's hope a Rainham CC tour gets back to being an annual event on the social/playing calendar. A big thank you to Jono for organising it and Jamie Adkins for arranging the fixtures.

Once the season finally got under way we fielded an under 12 team for the very first time by participating in this year's Peter Coe Cup in its new format. Their first match was on the first Bank Holiday in May at home against Maldon and after batting first and losing 4 wickets for 12 runs, the team rallied and ensured they batted out the full 25 overs scoring 66 for 9 with Kyan Lehal top scoring with 15 and some good support from Billy Bryant and Leo Fezvi-Hunt being undefeated on 7. Maldon knocked off the runs but not without losing 3 wickets taken by Charlie Vickers, Alfie Stounchbury and Louis Smith.

The next match was 2 weeks later against Woodford Green and this time Rainham bowled first and put in an excellent display in the filed taking sharp catches, stopping boundaries and bowling well restricting Woodford Green to81 all out in 21 overs. The wickets were shared by Charlie Vickers (3), Alfie Stounchbury (2), Kyan (1), Oliver Tully (1), Hayden Musham (1), Flynn Treanor (1) and a run out from Charlie.

The Rainham innings got off to a solid start as Leo and Hayden took the score onto 21 for the first wicket, but the solid start was followed by a flurry of wickets. The 'midnight revellers' of Kyan and Flynn then steadied the ship and started to keep the scoreboard ticking over when Kyan was bowled for 11, which was the 7<sup>th</sup> wicket to fall and the odds looking very much in favour of a Woodford Green victory with overs running out. This brought Olly Tully to the crease who batted sensibly taking quick singles at every opportunity to ensure Flynn took the bowling to keep the runs accumulating. Olly then lost his wicket with one over to go and 7 runs still required for victory and Flynn then took full responsibility hitting 2 consecutive balls for 4 and a 2 wicket victory with Flynn 20 not out. Well done to Jason Downton and Warren Courtney for managing the team and leading them to our first ever under 12s Peter Coe cup victory.

### **Playing Update**

# 1st Team

After 3 consecutive dodgy batting displays, one on tour, a friendly against Basildon and the first division 1 league game against Canvey the 1<sup>st</sup> team got their first victory against last season's top 4 team Brookweald, which we hope will give them the confidence in future league matches.

Unfortunately the next match against last season fellow promotes South Weald was another disappointing batting performance being dismissed for just 129, but a spirited bowling and fielding display could not prevent a 4 wicket loss.

Finally an excellent bowling display from Dpial (4 wickets) and Tyler (3 wickets) ensured  $2^{nd}$  top Great Totham were dismissed for just 104 and Rainham went on to win the match comfortably by 7 wickets to take the  $1^{st}$  team to  $6^{th}$  in the table after 4 matches.

### 2nd Team

After a good display in a friendly at Havering-atte-Bower losing in the last over after posting 245 it has been 3 consecutive victories with a reverse against Havering- atte-Bower II, Herongate and Great Wakering. The bowling has been on fire so far with all teams being dismissed for less than 100 with Harry Light and Abdal Altaf in the wickets and Daniel Purton making his 2<sup>nd</sup> XI debut with 2 wickets for 11 in 5 overs. Finally, another convincing bowling display against Mountnessing ensured the 4<sup>th</sup> game on the trot of dismissing the opposition for less than 100 and a 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive victory and the 2<sup>nd</sup> team top of the league at the end of the month.

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Team

A very young looking 3rd XI got the season off to a good start with a win against Great Baddow III and followed by a loss to Wickham II in our first match at a temporary new 3<sup>rd</sup> team home venue in Basildon. Jamie Eacott took 4 wickets in the first league victory and Ben Little has been in the runs with the bat. A second defeat by Rayleigh V was notable for the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI debut of Sam Crotch who was in the runs and wickets after being out of the game for a few years. The final match in May was against Eastwood III and a man of the match performance from Tony Stounchbury with 70 runs and a 53 run victory the leave the 3 team 5<sup>th</sup> at the end of the month.

## Sunday 1st Team

Two competitive matches for the Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> Team with a home loss against KTM where the batting was again a disappointment and followed by our first t20 Sunday cup fixture with a victory against Gidea Park and Romford which was notable for Jono's 80 in 35 balls with good support from Tom Herbert with 39 for a score of 164. This was followed by an equally impressive bowling display with Anish taking 5 wickets in just 4 overs (that's some achievement!) as Gidea Park were all out for 84.

The batting paradise of Hockerill was hoping to give our batters some confidence, which it certainly did as Sid (101) and Neeral (50) contributed to a total of 250 in a victory over Hockerhill. Daniel Purton capped off a fine weekend with another 4 wickets to add to the 2 he took the day before.

Sid continued his good Sunday form by scoring 91 in the win against Hainault & Clayhall CC in a Sunday league match, chasing 185 for 9. This was our first win in the Sunday League this year, with wickets being taken by Jono 3, Charlie 3 and Tyler 2.

#### Under 15s

Our first year in the Cox & Kings cup opened with an away match at Buckhurst Hill with the highlight's being Daniel Purton being run out after chasing his bat that came out of his hands while playing a shot and then getting run out, although he countered this by taking 2 wickets. Some further sharp fielding by Rainham lead to 5 run outs in the Buckhurst Hill innings, but could not present them scoring 153. In reply Rainham scored 76 for 9 with top scored being Raj Hothi with 18, James Clark 15 no and Anthony Connor 15.

This was followed by a Havering Cup defeat against Upminster as the 15s were bowled out for 48 and Upminster reaching their target losing just 3 wickets.

A friendly followed against Harold Wood with impressive batting from Jamie Eacott retiring on 30 and James Clark taking 4 wickets in just 3 overs for a win by 30 runs.

## <u>Under 13s</u>

Only one match for the under 13s in May taking on local rivals Goresbrook in a Havering cup match. Goresbrook batted first and were restricted in their run making early in the innings also losing a couple of wickets by Teddy Gough and Jake Downton. A few expensive overs ensured Goresbrook scored 114 for 5 in their 20 overs with further wickets being taken by Raj Hothi and run outs from Olly Tully and Flynn Treanor.

Raj opened the Rainham innings going on to retire on 30 and had good support from Jake Downton and Olly Tully as difficult batting conditions ensured Rainham lost just 3 wickets in reaching 70 runs and a 44 runs loss.


