Youth Teams Successes & Kenny Finally Scores a Half Century

There were a few historic moments for the club this month with the youth teams leading the way in rewriting the Rainham CC history book. After the under 13s gained their first ever point in the Havering League in tying with Hornchurch Athletic at the end of the previous month and at the start of June beat Harold Wood by 38 runs in a low scoring encounter at Spring Farm Park.

The under 11s finally got their campaign under way with some real bad luck with the weather and were defeated in their first match against a strong Upminster A team. In only their second game at Gidea Park and Romford in the glorious sunshine and endless supply of tea and Victoria Sponge from our marvellous hosts, Jay Downton's under 11s won by just 9 runs in a thrilling end which went right to the last over. There was some great batting, bowling and fielding from all the boys. A special mention to Ethan Smith who was struck on the head in his very first match going for a catch against Upminster, and the following week bravely played against Gidea Park and Romford and contributed a valuable 2 not out.

Finally well done to all the boys who have played in the under 16 joint team with Goresbrook by making it to the second stage of the Matchplay competition by scoring 325 against Basildon in their final league match for a 117 runs victory and finishing 2nd in their 5 team group. The Rainham boys definitely played their part with Ronnie Jackson and Tyler Bunn both scoring 75 and Bradley Manning adding a swift 45 not out at the end. The next group stage will be tough with matches against Wanstead, Upminster and Fives & Heronians, so good luck to all the boys in this valuable cricketing experience.

It was a real pleasure being present at all 3 of these special moments for the club and well done to Team Managers Paul Newman, Jason Downton and Coaches Steve Jackson, Adrian Moon and helper Warren Courtney for the time and effort they have put in with the boys during the last month.

Finally after many years down the club, Kenny Sims scored his first ever 50 for the club at Galleywood 3rd XI and then followed it up by 2 more in the next two 3rd XI fixtures against St. John's Billericay 2nd XI and Old Chelmsfordians 4th XI. Some say Kenny's a bit tight, but I am sure he will have bought his 3 jugs of beer for all down the club. This leaves Brearley's 3rd XI top of Division 12 at the half way stage of the season.

Playing Update

1st Team

Another mixed and traumatic month for the 1st XI with 2 consecutive defeats against Havering- atte-Bower and Writtle and then a real spirited 2 runs victory against Great Waltham with Jono and Ankit both scoring 70s and spinners Biren Patel, Alex Sullivan and Ankit sharing 8 wickets amongst themselves. This leaves the 1st XI in 7th place but in a league where no team seems to be taking control this could all change as they are only 26 points (or one full points victory) away from 2nd place.

2nd Team

Gibbo's XI are still going strong in 2nd place at the end of June with 3 victories against Mountnessing, a close 2 runs victory against Hockley and a 7 wickets victory against Rayleigh 4th XI. Only a 4 wicket loss to top of the table Terling 2nd XI spoilt an almost faultless month. Some good batting from Pauls Collis, Alex Sullivan, Tigsy, Ash Foster and Mickey Clifford during this month and good bowling from George Light, especially at the death against Hockley, Johnny Wratten and Dipal Patel being the highlights.

3rd Team

Four out of four for Brearley including a win against top of the table Great Baddow 4th XI, followed up by wins against Galleywood 3rd XI, St. John's Billericay 2nd XI and Old Moanfordians 4th XI. Georgie Gough has continued to impress with the bat and so has veteran Adrian Moon with impressive bowling displays from youngsters Abdul Altaf, Umer Ellahi, Charlie Puncher and Kenny (best all-rounder in the club!) Sims.

Georgie Gough's impressive displays were rewarded with an outing in the 2nd XI against Rayleigh 4th XI so it was very disappointing when Georgie dislocated his knee, which will probably end his season. We all wish Georgie a speedy recovery.

Youth Section

Under 11s

The under 11s finally got their first match under way against Upminster 'A' and a fine bowling and fielding display kept Upminster below 290 with the pick of the bowlers being Teddy Gough with 3 wickets and other highlights being great catches from Jake Downton and Thomas Chaplin. A defeat in the first game was then followed by a victory against Gidea Park and Romford by 9 runs, in a finger nail biting finish. Great displays from all the boys who all contributed with bat, ball and in the field, and a special mention for Charlie Vickers who scored 9 not, took 2 catches and 3 wickets.

The final match of the month was against Ardleigh Green who restricted the under 11s to just 235 runs, with the main difference being the loss of 10 wickets that cost 50 runs. Ardleigh Green batted well to steer themselves to victory by 45 runs. Overall a fantastic start for the under 11s, especially with a victory in only their second ever Havering League match

Under 13s

Yet another busy month for the under 13s with 3 havering League matches, 2 Peter Coe Cup matches and a Havering Cup match. The very first match of the month was against Harold Wood in the league and after a below par batting display being dismissed for just 65 runs, the bowlers did a fantastic job of dismissing Wood for just 28 runs for a first ever under 13 Havering League win. A nice day out at high Roding in the Peter Coe Cup saw High Roding score a massive 330 runs in their 30 overs with Raj Hothi taking 3-37. This was followed by a spirited batting display where the under 13s batted out the 30 over losing just 7 wickets and scoring 149 runs with Nakul Patel scoring 26 not out Harry Spear finally surpassing 12 runs, scoring 21, and James Clark and Jamie Eacott both getting into double figures. Scott Mansfield also looked good opening, before being run out.

Three further defeats followed in the Havering Cup against Gidea Park and Romford, a league match against Goresbrook and a Peter Coe Cup defeat against Hornchurch, but on each occasion there was some good individual displays and improvement.

Under 15s

The under 15s started the month off with a league defeat a Gidea Park and Romford where Ronnie Jackson got the team off the a blistering start scoring a quick 30, including a ball losing 6 in a neighbouring garden (Not good when we are supplying the ball!). Harry Spear supported Ronnie well at the top of the innings scoring his usual 12. Under 13s Brandon Honey and Ben Little also batted well as the team were bowled out for 92. Gidea Park and Romford reached the total with 5 overs to spare with Umer Ellahi being the pick of the Rainham bowlers with 2 for 23.

Umer ‘Ellahi and Abdul Altaf were the stand out bowlers against Goresbrook taking 2 for 9 and 1 for 19 respectively as Goresbrook went on the score 110 for 4 in their 20 overs. Top score for Rainham was Joe Attfield (19), Umer Ellahi (13), Bradley Manning (12no) and Abdul Altaf (12) as the under 15s were bowled out for just 66.

The final match of the month was an exciting 2 run defeat against Hornchurch Athletic. Athletic batted first scoring 122 with captain on the day Abdul taking 2 for 17. Good support Tyler Bunn and Ronnie Jackson also contributed to the wicket tally. In reply Rainham lost Alex Nicholl first ball quickly followed by the run out of Ciaran Simpkins and the LBW of Umer leaving the score on just 11 for 3. A great partnership from Ronnie Jackson (52 no) and Abdul (29) took the under 15s to 113 for 5 with 5 overs remaining. Despite the valiant efforts of Daniel Courtney, Charlie Puncher and Joe Attfield the run chase fell short by just 2 runs in a very exciting match.

Under 16s

The combined Rainham and Goresbrook under 16s needed to win their final match after 1 win, 1 abandoned game and one loss, to finish second in their group and progress to the second stages of the Essex Matchplay competition. The combined XI batted first and got off to a storming start with both openers scoring 50 and Ronnie Jackson adding 75 of these before being controversially being given out LBW! Tyler Bunn came in at 4 and continued where the openers left off blasting 75 runs of his own before being bowled. At the end of the innings Bradley Manning hit a quick 45 not out to set Basildon a massive target of 325 for victory in 40 overs.

Basildon batted well in reply but could only make 208 in their 40 overs with Umer Ellahi taking a wicket on his under 16 debut.

The second stage draw pitted the Combined XI against Upminster, Fives and Heronians and their first game against a strong Wanstead under 16s. Wanstead came out on top in this match dismissing the under 16s for just 89 runs and knocking the runs off losing just 3 wickets, but a great achievement making the second group stage and fantastic experience of playing against teams of this calibre can do our boys nothing but good.
