Playing Update

Saturday 1st Team (James Mansfield)

2nd July v Rayleigh Fairview II – ‘**Collis steers Rainham to victory**’

James Fuller took the helm for this game as the captain was away. He started as he meant to carry on by winning the toss and with Rainham's bowling attack decided to bowl first. Both Rayleigh's openers were dismissed by both our openers for just one run. Ian and James went on to claim 5 more scalps between them for just 62 runs. Jas Hothi, the ever dependable John Wratten and Alex Sullivan got in on the act bowling the rest of Rayleigh out for 141. The only resistance was presented by their middle order, nudging a few runs between them; with one player making 42 before John had him trapped LBW.

After the break Rainham lost a quick wicket with Alex being caught by the opposition. Was this the start of the collapse? No! Joe Sarro and Paul Collis took us to 93 with Paul scoring a quick fire 52. JUG! Joe could not see us through (perhaps it was the thought of purchasing a jug) and he was dismissed for 39 on the 120 mark, leaving Dave Adkins and James Fuller to finish the match off. 143 for 3 another comprehensive victory for Rainham.

9th July v Purleigh – ‘**Opening bowlers wreak havoc**’

Purleigh beat us the first game of the season, so Rainham had a real incentive to exact revenge this week! The skipper was back, but perhaps should have sent Fuller out for the toss as he lost it and Rainham were put into bat. Alex hit a quick 18 runs before falling to the young Essex spinner. Then Joe fell for 28 with the score on 79. Paul got started and then went back to the club house with 30 to his name and this seemed to be the case for a lot of the Rainham bats. Many starts but nothing substantial. Ash Foster did his best scoring a splendid 43, but did not have time to reach his 50. Rainham eventually finished for 192 for 8 from their 45 overs. Not a great score, but considering the size of the ground and Rainham's bowling attack this was a good enough total to try and defend.

James Fuller and Ian Havard were obviously on a promise as their opener fell first ball of the innings, followed by 2, 3, 4 and 5 for just 20 runs. Ian Havard claimed in 3 wickets for 19 runs and was replaced by John Wratten who got straight in on the act! After claiming his 5th scalp for just 20 runs from 10 overs Fuller was replaced by Jim "Elmar Fudd" Mansfield who only managed a maiden before John claimed the remaining wickets to finish with 2 for 6 from 2.2. John Wratten opened and must have regretted the decision at the toss as he saw his first 2 ball fly straight back past him for 4! Ian then sorted that out at the other end and clean bowled him. John then got in on the act

after some superb slip fielding by Jas. I would describe the catch but he has probably already told you all! Alex joined in on the slip action and took another catch from Johns bowling. Rainham have a nice little competition running between the two slip fielders and it is a closely run contest! Long may it continue! So with the opposition on no more than 30 with 5 wickets down Rainham did the usual and took their foot off the pedal! Unfortunately the whole team went slack in the field and instead of bowling them out for 70/80 runs we allowed them to get back into the game and score 134. Their Captain put in an excellent (if not somewhat fortunate innings) scoring 49 with some support from the bowlers.

Morale was low at tea, but if put in perspective it was only 134 runs we had to get and Alex went out with exactly that attitude, scoring 54 Not Out seeing the team through to the end. This was the biggest game of the season. Great Totham were 3rd in the league and were snapping at our heels with Rayleigh. So it was a must win game for us. With that in mind you would have thought the team would be pumped..... we were not. We were awful! We did not play as a team and became too negative too soon. After Ian removed the opener for 2 Great Totham re-started like a freight train! They had almost 100 runs on the board by the 10th over. Pace was removed and John Wratten and Elmar Fudd came on to try and stem the flow. From their 24 overs 62 was conceded for 4 wickets, John claiming 3 of them. This put Rainham back into some sort of respectable position and we finally found a bit of character. Garnet came on to claim two wickets and Jas finished the innings off. Overall we made a good comeback and limited them to 204 for 7 from 45 overs. Considering the pace of the outfield this was not a bad total to end up chasing.

Alex and Paul opened. Paul was shafted by a pea roller early on and Alex top edged a ball that sat up to the keeper. Joe was then caught out and Rainham were in trouble. Jas and Garnet tried to steady the ship, but scoring was hard as the pitch was playing havoc. Although Jas only scored 6 he managed to hang around and put on a partnership with Garnet, before he was bowled. Rainham were not only running out of bat they were also running out of time. Fuller, Burr and Jack McMahon dashed a quick 43 between them, with Garnet falling for a well grafted 70. At one point there was some glimmer of hope that we may make the runs but we were eventually dismissed for 179 - 25 short of our target.

So our second loss of the season and an end to our unbeaten run. Hopefully this is a good reminder to **all** involved that we still have to give everything we have every game if we are going to win this league. Let's hope we can bounce back next week!

2nd July v St. Johns Billericay II – **‘Young bowling attack shines’**

On paper this was going to be a tough game against 2nd in the table St. Johns Billericay who had only lost one match against top of the league Great Baddow III. Brearley went into this match with a young bowling attack of George Light, Reiss Sims, Ricky Cooper, Dan Skipper and, making his Mid Essex League debut, under 15 Captain Dan Elliot. The average age of this attack was just over 16 years. All the young bowlers bowled well taking 2 wickets a piece with the performance of the day being Dan Elliot who bowled the maximum 12 over finishing with figures of 2 for 33 with his leg spin, including the dismissal of the St. Johns opener who had made 52. St Johns were finally dismissed for 179 which could have been better with the last 2 wickets putting on over 70 runs.

This left a gettable target of 180 and experienced openers Mickey Callaghan (very in Mick’s case) and Paul ‘Tarquin’ Margiotta set about the task with gusto putting on over 150 for the first wicket before Mickey was caught after making 69 runs. A slight hiccup of Dan Skipper being run out left Mickey and Jack McMahon to steer Rainham home with 3 overs and 8 wickets to spare and probably the best team performance of the season so far from a young 2nd XI.

9th July v Little Baddow III – **‘Fathers and sons lead Rainham to victory’**

After the stand out performance of the previous week Brearley was determined to keep the momentum going and it was Little Baddow that stood in the way, who the 2nd team beat in the first league match of the season. Brearley took to the field with 3 father and son combinations of Dave and Jamie Adkins, Kenny and Reiss Sims and finally Pete and Dan Elliot, which is probably the first time in the club’s history that this has happened. Rainham batted first with openers Mickey Callaghan and Dan Skipper taking 50 mark for the first wicket when Mickey was dismissed for 27. Dan Skipper continued made 65 (is he going trying to go for 1000 runs this season?) before being run out for 1 succession. Excellent support from Adrian Moon (39), Dave Adkins (27) and Kenny Sims (31no) ensured Rainham accumulated 213 runs losing just 4 wickets.

Jamie Adkins was hungry to bowl after his bowless debut for the 1st XI the previous week and took the new ball with the consistent George Light. Both took early wickets with George finishing on 2 for 21 and Jamie 3 for 28. The Sims family then finished off the Baddow innings with Reiss taking 1 wicket and Kenny taking 4 and, I am not making this up, but Kenny actually caught 2 also!! Under 15s

3rd July v Hornchurch Athletic – **‘Improved batting display from the under 15s’**

Georgie was then bowled for 9 which led to another 3 quick wickets tumbling. Ronnie Jackson (29), William Emsden (6) and Ricky Anatol (18) all batted well taking Rainham to 114 all out in 19.3 overs and the best batting display of the season to date and a wicket that was generally keeping low.

Hornchurch Athletic’s openers looked solid steadily taking them to 40 runs before Harry Light took the first wicket with a catch from Ricky Cooper. Athletic’s number 3 continued in the same way as the openers before being bowled by Ricky Cooper with the score on 80. Charlie Gregory then struck with Georgie Gough taking a difficult catch, but one of the Hornchurch openers was still at the crease and finally made his 50 with the last ball of the 19th over taking Athletic to a deserved victory. A good game and almost a taste of victory from the improving under 15s.

10th July v Upminster ‘B’ **‘Jackson in the runs again’**

This was a friendly match against Upminster ‘B’ who won the toss and chose to bat. Excellent bowling spells from Harry Light (4 overs for just 7 runs), Georgie Gough (2 wickets for 13 in 4) and further wickets from Sam Russell and Ronnie Jackson restricted Upminster to 120 for 4.

Ronnie Jackson and Kieran Howard put on 40 for the first wicket before Ronnie was caught top scoring on 24 and was followed by 5 quick wickets which left the under 15s struggling to reach the total. Sam Russell and Charlie Gregory hit a flurry of runs at the end and were not out on 19 and 13 respectively leaving Rainham just 28 short of the required target, which was an improved performance against the same team earlier in the season.

Rainham were finally all out for 43 and look forward to their final 2 league encounters against Ardleigh Green and Goresbrook.

The under 13’s then dug in and in the last 9 overs too a further 4 wickets for only 32 runs. Rainham lost opener Nathan Adkins and number 3 Brandon honey in the first over and were on the back foot right from the start. Ciaran Simpkins then got Rainham off the mark, but another 6 quick wickets followed. Other scorers were Alex Nicholl, Callum Storey and Callum Bennett in Rainham’s final total of 18 all out.

This was the final game of the Havering League campaign and after 8 successive defeats the under 13s were keen to go out on a high, but were unfortunate to lose 2 players before the game with illness. Rainham were put into bat and got off to a nervous start losing the wickets of Nathan Adkins, Brandon Honey and Callum Storey. This then heralded the arrival of Ronnie ‘The Messiah’ Jackson who was called up as a late replacement, which was greeted by great joy by the rest of the team. Captain Charlie Puncher then rearranged the batting order and put in Ronnie at number 6 after Alex Nicholl had kept the Goresbrook bowlers at bay, before losing his wicket. Bradley Manning batted well with Ronnie landing good support and they put on a partnership of 30 before Ronnie played on and lost his wicket, making 16. Bradley then went for 10 and Rainham’s innings was wrapped up in the 20th over, all out for 64.

Goresbrook got off to a good start, just easing above the required run rate. Wickets tumbled at regular intervals with Brandon Honey taking his first wicket of the season and other wicket takers being Bradley Manning, Charlie Puncher and Callum Storey after great diving catch by Nathan Adkins. Another excellent bowling spell from Alex Nicholl claimed another Goresbrook wicket before one of the opposition batsman retired on 25. Good bowling spells from Callum Bennett, Jamie Eacott and Ciaran Simpkins could not prevent Goresbrook from reaching their required target with 1 over to spare to end a very enjoyable first season for the under 13s in the Havering League.
