Under 13s in Peter Coe Cup

Now our youth section numbers are fairly healthy and indoor winter nets continue to be well attended, history will again be made for Rainham Cricket Club with the under 13s being entered into the prestigious Essex Cricket Board Peter Coe Cup competition in 2014. This is 30 overs a side format with 32 clubs entered and there are 4 groups of 8 teams. Our group consists of the following with the fixtures to be played on the dates listed.

- Monday 26th May v Billericay (home)
- Sunday 8th June v High Roding (away)
- Sunday 22nd June v Hornchurch (home)
- Sunday 13th July v Wanstead (away)
- Sunday 27th July v Upminster (home)

These are all against clubs with well established youth sections, but this should give our youth section some good experience that will hold them in good stead in their future cricketing years. Good luck to under 13s Manager Paul Newman and Coach Adrian Moon in these fixtures, which hopefully is the beginning of Rainham entering this competition on an annual basis.

Playing Update – Indoor Season

Bradley Slays Eastonians

1st December 'D' Team v Eastonians – After 2 heavy defeats the 'D' team were keen to do themselves justice on a day where 2 matches to put things right. Rainham were put into bat and openers Charlie Puncher and Peter Reynolds got off to a good start, with Reynolds playing the Mickey Callaghan role and pinching all the bowling to retire on 25 not out in the fifth over. Bradley Manning came in and scored some quick runs before being caught soon followed by Callum Bennett. This brought indoor debutant Umer Ellani to the crease whom ensured that Eastonians would have to work for their wickets. Charlie then departed but not after making 12 runs and then Danny Sadai and Umer continued to keep the scoreboard steadily until Umer was bowled. Peter Reynolds joined Danny for the last over and 23 runs were scored taking the team total to 88 for 4 with Danny 10 not out at the end and Peter 41 not out.

This was a good score to defend and the field of 3 on off and 1 in front on leg proved its worth to Charlie's bowling where Eastonian's opener tried to force him to leg and then Bradley pulled off a fantastic diving catch in the gully to lead to the first wicket. Some further tight bowling from Callum and Charlie ensured Eastonian's had to work for their runs followed by Umer taking his maiden indoor wicket and Bradley gaining inspiration from his earlier diving catch to take 4 wickets including the final one for the 'D' team's first victory.

Charlie Bats Through in Vain

1st December 'D' Team v Old Gaynes –Rainham were again put into bat and Peter and Charlie were determined to get off to a good start which is exactly what happened until Peter edged one to the keeper in the 3rd over. Adrian Moon then came in and went out after one ball, his second dismissal this indoor season and only 1 ball faced. Bradley Manning then made a few before being caught again, this time off the wall. Umer again showed some good resistance before being bowled, as Charlie continued his innings including a nice straight 6. Danny kept Charlie company almost to the end but he was also bowled as Charlie batted right through for 18 not out and a total 59 for 5.

Wickets would have to be the order of the day for the bowlers and again the 3 fielders on off and 1 on leg to Charlie's bowling paid dividends as the first 2 Gaynes wickets went early, with another being a fantastic catch in the gully, this time from Adrian Moon whose commitment was second to none. Further sharp fielding from Charlie led to the third Gaynes wicket, although they were steadily building the runs. Adrian Moon then took a wicket with assistance from a good catch from Umer. Gaynes required about 10 more runs at this stage and the game was in the balance but some confident batting from Old Gaynes last pair saw them to a well deserved but hard fought victory.

Deja Vous for Tyler and George

1st December 'C' Team v Brothers – This was more like twins as it was a second outing against the same opposition in 3 matches, but this time Rainham were asked to bat first and openers Cookie and Tyler Bunn got Rainham off to a good start with Cookie making 18 (The real cookie would settle for that at the moment!) and Tyler scoring 20 to set a good platform. A little blip in the middle led to the wickets of Harry Light and George Gough going cheaply and then George Light and Charlie Puncher (playing his 3rd consecutive match) took the team total to 81 for 4 with George Light top scoring on 22 not out.

After a confident batting display the young bowlers were keen to be unleashed and it proved to be the case with Tyler and George Light being just as destructive with the ball. Tyler took 3 wickets, George 2 and George Gough finished off Brothers for a second time to lead the 'C' team to victory and top Division 3 at this stage.

Jasi Leads from the Front

8th December 'B' Team v Dagenham Post – A double fixture for the 'B' Team and the first opponents were Dagenham Post, who batted first. Post were immediately on the back foot with Jono taking an early wicket, but the bowling display of the day had to go to 'B' Team captain Jas Hothi delivered 4 wickets for just 3 runs (Just short of a club honours tie again) as Post were dismissed for just 42 runs.

This is a total that should definitely be reached, but the batsman struggled as wickets continued to tumble until another Captain's contribution from Jas with 19 ensured the target of 43 was reached after 5 wickets and 3 wins out of 3 for the 'B' team.

'B' Must be for Bowling

8th December 'B' Team v Goresbrook 'B' – Two undefeated teams took part in the second of the 'B' team matches and as usual against a Goresbrook Team it proved to be a tough encounter. Goresbrook batted first and good bowling again restricted the opposition to 63 all out with Jas taking another 3 wickets and Jono 2 to set a target that is below average in indoor cricket.

A team consisting of Jas, Jono, James Fuller, Sid Patel, Joe Sarro and Dan Skipper would normally be capable of scoring 63 runs, but they continued to bat in the same way as their first match, by gifting their wickets away too easily. A miserable total of 36 all out is likely to leave the 'B' Team in second place behind Goresbrook, but with another 4 games after Christmas it's still all to play for.

'A' Star performances from Sid, Alex and Jono

15th December 'A' Team v Upminster 'A' – this was a double header Sunday with the first being against mid table Upminster 'A'. Rainham batted first and the ongoing indoor batting problems continued to surface with Rainham getting off to a dreadful start languishing on 13 for 3. Then it was the time for the 'Boycott' batting styles of Sid Patel and Jono to make hay when the sun shines by clubbing the Upminster bowlers to all parts of the Sports Hall (but mainly the back wall) to secure a total of 45no for Sid and 38 no for Jono for a good total of 97 for 5 and a tough target to chase.

Upminster went about their task in a manner you would expect from a class outfit, but then Alex Sullivan's variety of spin ensured the opposition got stuck in a rut with Alex finishing with an impressive 3 for 5 off of his 3 overs. Jono also took 3 catches in the field which contributed to Upminster being all out for 70 runs and a first indoor victory of the season for the 'A' Team.

Jasi 'The Reserve' holds his Nerve

15th December 'A' Team v Goresbrook 'A' – Unusual for any Goresbrook team in that they were coming into this match with a played 2 lost 2 record. After a win against Upminster it was straight back into action, but this time bowling first. The star man on this occasion was Jono taking 2 for 9 from as Goresbrook managed to score 72 runs at the end of their innings.

This time things were not so simple with the game going right to the wire, with James Fuller's stand in Jas Hothi continued with his recent indoor form with some good quality batting retiring on 25 runs. In the last over Tom Herbert was run out for the 2nd match in succession, which brought Jas back into bat, staking a claim to play ahead of James Fuller on a permanent basis, and secured victory with just 2 balls to spare in a well fought victory, which puts the 'A' team up to mid table after propping up the league at the start of the day.

Winter nets recommences on Friday 3rd January 2014 for the junior section and on Wednesday 8th January for the senior section. It's the usual 7pm start until 8pm for both sessions and with 4 batting lanes is good value for £4 seniors and £3 for juniors and concessions.
